This week, our focus is on Gaza. Despite six months of relentless attacks, Israel finds itself no closer to victory than it was since it began its bombing campaign in October last year. Its plans in Gaza, beyond the ongoing assault, remain unknown, while the death toll keeps rising.

Additionally, we also look at what could be Iran's likely response to a suspected Israeli attack on its consulate in Syria's Damascus last week.

Finally, in the Philippines, residents in the remote island of Itbayat are finding themselves directly in the eye of any potential conflict between China and Taiwan.
