



On Monday morning, Israelis started their day with the news that an anti-tank missile was fired from Lebanon at agricultural workers across the border. Magen David Adom paramedics and EMTs were there in minutes, treating seven casualties and evacuating the most seriously wounded by Medevac helicopter to nearby hospitals.

The attacks haven't been limited to rockets. Last week, MDA first responders were called to the scene of a gas station in Judea and Samaria, where a terrorist had opened fire. The victims — a 57-year-old father and MDA volunteer and a 16-year-old student he had offered a ride to — did not survive.

And, yesterday, MDA treated a 64-year-old man who was stabbed in a terror attack in Jerusalem.
