On October 6, 1973, as Israel and Jews around the world began observing Yom Kippur, the Jewish State was attacked by surprise by the combined armies of Egypt and Syria. The approximately three week war that followed, which became known as the Yom Kippur War, is one of the most controversial in Israel's history. While the Israel Defense Force (IDF) was victorious in the end, a board of inquiry was held to look into why the military was not prepared for the attack and its conclusions led to the resignations of Prime Minister Golda Meir and Defense Minister Moshe Dayan.
