

SWC Associate Dean and Director of Global Social Action, Rabbi Abraham Cooper, was in Japan to discuss growing anti-Semitism around the globe, Japan's UN vote, the adoption of IHRA and Israel-Japan relations. While in Tokyo, Rabbi Cooper:



- Attended the opening ceremony of "The Courage To Remember: The Holocaust 1939-1945" exhibit at Soka University which also highlights Japanese diplomat and hero Chiune Sugihara as well as the life of Anne Frank. (pictured above)
- Urged Japan's State Secretary of Foreign Affairs to adopt the IHRA definition of anti-Semitism as well as to register the Center's concern that the growing relationship between Japan and Israel is not reflected in Japan's UN votes
- Attended a meeting with the National Security Council, as well as nine members of the National Diet, the Japanese Parliament, where he raised the issue of adopting IHRA as well as Japan-Israel relations
- Met with representatives of the Uyghur and Rohingya refugees
